II. THE DOCUMENT (Sardar As cad Collection)

This raqam is by far the largest—ca. 75 x 40 cm—and most imposing of the eighteenth century document relating to the Bakhtiyari. The document is written in nastacliq, and is centered left, with the text running up the left margin. Ismacil III's—Karim Khan's Safavid puppet who at this early date is still taken seriously—domed—block seal, which reads "In the Name of God, the slave of the King of Sanctity [cAli], Ismacil." This seal is centered in the top margin. On the dorse are seven seals and six signatures (unread). Karim Khan's seal, which appears on all subsequent Bakhtiyari documents, is not found on this one.

The siyaq, 350 tumans, above line 16 represents half of the total written in the document as confirmation [?] that the figure is correct.

III. SIGNIFICANCE

1. Abdal, son of Ali Salih, is appointed governor of Iraq (West-central Iran) with an annual stipend of 700 tumans.
